<b>WA-AIM</b> ELA, Math and Science-grades 3-8, 10, 11	Required for Federal Accountability	<b>State Testing Window: Jan. 29- May 3, 2024</b>
<b>OSPI-Developed Assessments Assessed in the Elementary, Middle and High school grade bands</b> Social Studies The Arts Health and PE Educational Tech	Required for State Accountability (OSPI)	For each school year, school districts are required to report their implementation of assessments <b>no later than June 28, 2024</b> . Teachers communicate assessment score as assessments are completed.
<b>National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)</b> (Reading and Math-grades 4,8)	Required by Federal Law	NAEP selects schools by a stratified random sampling procedure; students in those schools are selected randomly. Individual score reports will not be provided to families.
<b>WIDA Annual/Alternate Access</b> Grades K-12	Required by the State of Washington for English Language Proficiency	<b>Online State Testing Window: January 29-March 22, 2024</b>
<b>WaKIDS-Washington Kindergarten Inventory of Developing Skills (Kindergarten)</b>	Required by the State of Washington- WaKIDS isn't a test. Kindergarten teachers observe children during everyday classroom activities	By <b>November 15, 2023</b> teachers take an inventory of each child's developing skills in six areas: Social Emotional, Physical, Cognitive, Language, Literacy and Math

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
