- Be sure PLC members are clear about expectations for meeting preparation and the agenda.
- Facilitate the meetings to the keep the discussion on topic and moving at a purposeful

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pace.

- Be a key communicator between principal, support team and the PLC by being a member of Building Instructional Support Team (IST).
- Meet with the principal as directed to coordinate the PLC's work.
- PLC Leader will ensure that the PLC Groups will work in accordance with the districts "Effective PLCs" guidelines.

Qualifications:

- Prior experience with Grandview PLC process.
- Connection to the group you wish to lead.
- Organization skills.
- Ability to focus and keep a team focused on the PLC goals and process.
- Consensus building skills.
- Analysis of student work and data skills.
- Understanding of key curriculum concepts related to their level or area.
